

Chick in an egg cup card

Age:4-8 Group size: 6

Duration: 30 mins



Preparation time: 40 mins

Resources

- White card 22cms x 24 cms pieces
- Template for card 22cms x 12cms
- Chick template
- Egg cup template (optional)
- Glue sticks
- Yellow paper 12cms x 10cms pieces
- Red paper 4cms x 3cms pieces
- Yellow paper 5cms x 4cms pieces
- Scissors
- Paper for egg cup 11cms x 13cms



Note: Other cards on this page use the same chick so one template will do several types of card.

Preparation

Each child will need one of each piece of paper and card, a pencil and scissors. Each group will need templates (1 between 2) and glue sticks. Make a template of an egg in a cup to fit the



white card when folded in half, keep the sides of the egg cup straight as one of them is for the folded side.

Make another template and cut out the egg cup part.

The chick is a very basic shape as are the wings and beak, make templates for each of them. Attach a tab to the wing shape so that it

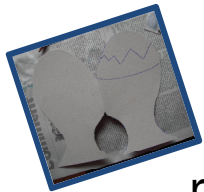


can stick onto the chick.

Activity

With the longest side of the card facing them, children fold the card in half from side to side. Keeping the edge of the template along the fold, draw around it and cut out,

making sure not to cut down the left side of the egg cup.



Open the card out and draw a jagged line on the right hand egg, cut it out to make the broken egg.

Either decorate the egg cup with coloured pens or use the egg cup template to draw around on coloured paper and stick on the card front.

Take the large piece of yellow paper and the chick template, draw around and cut out.

Draw around the wing on the smaller piece of yellow paper and cut out, fold the tab at the top of the wing, apply glue and stick onto the chick. Draw an eye, cut out a red beak and stick it onto the chick.

The chick sits in the cracked eggshell with the wing holding it in place.
