

Pop up bouquet card

Age:8-11 Group size: 20

Duration: 25 mins



Preparation time: mins

Resources

- Card 16cms wide x 21cms tall
- Sugar paper 14cms x 19cms
- Rulers
- Pattern edged scissors
- Scissors
- Pencils
- Card off cuts 3cms square
- Felt pens
- Glue sticks

Preparation

Each child needs a ruler, pencil, a piece of card, 4 of the 3cms squares and a piece of sugar paper for the insert.



Technique

Fold the card so that it measures 8cms wide. Fold the insert in half also so that it is 7cms wide. At

some point just above halfway down the closed insert, draw a line from the fold measuring 3.5 cms. Use the pattern edged scissors to cut a slit along the line you have drawn.

Open the insert out with the fold downwards. From each edge of the slit rule a diagonal line down to the fold line. Use the ruler and the edge of a pair of scissors to score the 2 diagonal lines.



Close the insert again then gently pull out first one side of the slit and then the other to make the pop- out wrapping

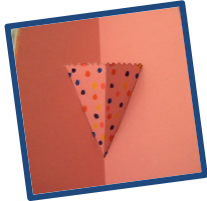

paper for the flowers. The score line will help the diagonal line to pull out and then the centre fold is reversed for that

part of the card. Define the wrapping paper by outlining it and drawing a design.

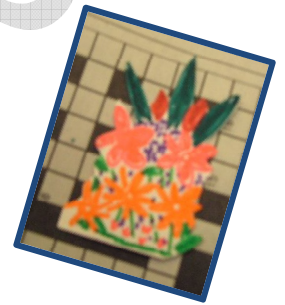


Stick the insert onto the main card. Glue a line of glue around the outside edge. Make sure the fold

of the insert is exactly in line with the card fold.

Draw flowers on the 4 small squares of card and cut to shape them.

Glue 2 at the front and stick behind the wrapping paper pop- out and 2 at the back on either side of the fold line.



Decorate the inside of the card with a message or stick more decorations on either side of the bouquet. In the finished example, wrapping ribbon has been used to create a simple border and a silver pen to write the message.
