

# Snowy picture

Age:6-9

Group size: class

Duration: 30 mins



Preparation time: 30mins

## Resources

- Small bag icing sugar
- Pva glue
- Templates – houses, birds, branches, cars, trees etc
- Backing paper A3, grey/blue
- Scissors
- Pencils
- White paper A3
- Felt pens
- Black paper
- Scraps of yellow paper
- Hole punch



## Preparation

Icing sugar makes great snow. Provide the children with the backing paper and white paper to make a background for their picture. Let them choose templates to draw around, cut out and use to create their picture. The

instructions below are for the picture in the photograph. You will need a bird template, branch template and one of a tree/bush or house. Punch eyes out of yellow paper using a hole punch.

## Activity

Line the white paper up with the backing paper and draw a wavy line about halfway up and all the way across. Cut the wavy line and glue the snowy background onto the backing paper.



# Snowy picture

Age:6-9

Group size: class

Duration: 30 mins



Carefully draw around, then cut out, a branch and a bare winter tree. Glue the branch so that it appears to come into the foreground from the right hand side of the picture. Add the tree and



glue it to the top of the white paper where it meets the sky.

Draw around a template of a blackbird onto black paper and cut it out. Cut a small narrow triangular beak and glue it to the head.

Glue a yellow hole punched circle for the eye, then draw a smaller black circle inside it. Colour the small circle black. Glue the bird onto the branch and draw the legs and feet with a grey, black or brown pen.



Smear thin lines of glue where you think the snow would settle. Sprinkle icing sugar onto the glue. Shake off the excess.
